Provision will be from 8.55am to 3.30pm, 7 days of the week.

Children eligible for Free School Meals can collect a grab bag lunch from school each day, but must inform school by 9.30am, if required that day.

### **Key Workers**

UK Government has published the following definitions for Key Workers:

The childcare provision for children of key workers must only be used where parents are unable to work from home and it is essential for frontline provision. We will not take children where it is a convenience for those working at home, as this does not fall in line with the guidance regarding social distancing, etc.

If you do not fall within the list of keyworkers, please do not request childcare provision.

If you are a keyworker but your partner isn't, please make other arrangements.

- **Health and social care**

Doctors, nurses, midwives, paramedics, social workers, care workers, and other frontline health and social care staff including volunteers; the support and specialist staff required to maintain the UK's health and social care sector; those working as part of the health and social care supply chain, including producers and distributors of medicines and medical and personal protective equipment.

- **Education and childcare**

Nursery and teaching staff, social workers and specialist education professionals.

- **Key public services**

Those essential to the running of the justice system, religious staff, charities and workers delivering key frontline services, management of the deceased, journalists and broadcasters providing public service broadcasting.

- **Local and national government**

Administrative occupations essential to the effective delivery of the COVID-19 response or delivering essential public services such as the payment of benefits.

- **Food and other necessary goods**

Those involved in food production, processing, distribution, sale and delivery as well as those essential to the provision of other key goods (for example hygienic and veterinary medicines).

- **Public safety and national security**

Police and support staff, Ministry of Defence civilians, armed forces personnel, fire and rescue, National Crime Agency, border security, prison and probation staff.

- **Transport**

This includes those who will keep the air, water, road and rail passenger and freight transport modes operating during the COVID-19 response, including those working on transport systems through which supply chains pass.

- **Essential Utilities, communication and financial services**
