I hope you have seen the video showing ways for children to keep safe on their return, but here are a few extra points we wanted to share.

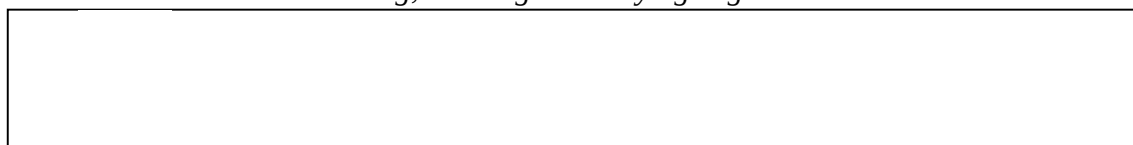
